Closing the Distance Between Us

rdinarily, we try to give plenty of space for the Advent season before we turn our sights toward Christmas, which doesn't begin until December 25. Most years, to be honest, this is a struggle for us. But this is no ordinary year, and this won't be an ordinary holiday season. Given all that we have been through since March, and as we prepare ourselves for what will be a difficult winter, we need to hold on to the story of Christmas all the more, the birth of a child who promised a new future for God's people, the Word made flesh. To celebrate the Incarnation is to acknowledge that with the birth of Christ, in love, God closes the distance between us—the distance between God and humanity. Christmas is about God coming close to us. Coming close, however, takes on new meaning this year as we, in love, work to intentionally keep a safe distance from one another. In our time apart our life together is seen for the precious thing that it is. I can't take credit for these thoughts. It was my good friend Christy Waltersdorff who first suggested it to me several weeks ago. It's the theme for her church throughout Advent and she has allowed me to "borrow" it. (I'll repay her with some really good chocolate).

This special newsletter provides an overview of all the ways we will strive to close the distance between us this Advent and Christmas. The issue covers four areas: Worship, Devotion and Prayer, Education, and service/giving. *O, Come, let us adore him! Christ the Lord!*

Worship

Lord's Supper the First Sunday of Advent November 29

We will celebrate the Lord's Supper on the First Sunday of Advent, November 29. We will light the Advent candles each week. And most of the scripture texts will focus on the birth narratives from Luke's Gospel.

New! An Advent Candlelight Vesper Service

Tentatively scheduled for 7 p.m. on December 13 (or Dec. 20 depending upon the weather). Join us for an outdoor vespers service on the church lawn (near the tower door and ramp). Hear the Christmas story and music of the season. (Facemasks and safe distance will be required). Everyone will then be invited to walk (single-file at a safe distance) through the sanctuary to see it decorated for Christmas. We know there is a deep desire to be near the building and to enter again that holy space.

Blue Christmas Service Monday, December 21 at 7 p.m.

Our Blue Christmas Service will be on the longest night of the year, Monday, December 21 at 7 p.m. This year in particular we need a time to sit with our sadness, sorrow, and grief, acknowledge our feelings and emotions, and find God's light shining in darkness. This service will be shared on Facebook Live.

Christmas Eve, Thursday, December 24 Family at 4 p.m. Candlelight at 8 p.m.

Our traditional Christmas Eve services will be

pre-recorded and premiered on Facebook and YouTube. The Family Service will be at 4 p.m. and the Candlelight Service will be at 8 p.m.

New! Zoom Worship December 27 and January 3

Worship on these Sunday will take place at the usual time but on Zoom (and not on Facebook or YouTube). We'll share the Zoom link several days in advance. We imagine these services to be very casual (feel free to wear your pjs). Using this format for worship will give our music staff and camera/worship production team a well-earned break.
