Session Meeting Highlights

The coronavirus pandemic has not stopped the work of the church! Your Session has been meeting more frequently lately, and using Zoom to meet online in view of the coronavirus pandemic restrictions. Following are highlights from the Session meeting on November 4, 2020.

- Session approved a proposal from the Deacons to establish a Prayer Line, where members could phone in and leave a message with prayer requests. A Deacon will return the call, and offer a prayer with the member.
- The Finance Committee reports that the church finances are in a good position for this time of year, with active online giving, support of special offerings, and controlled expenses, leading to an expectation of a balanced budget by year's end. Appreciation is expressed to the congregation for their continued financial support of our ministry.
- A New Members Orientation class for those interested in joining CPC is being planned for November 19 via Zoom. Watch the eNews for meeting details.
- The annual Stewardship campaign is underway, with letters and pledge cards being mailed out. Members are urged to make their pledges,

either by mailing in their pledge card or by [pledging online using the pledge form](#) on the CPC website.

■ The Child Care Council Co-Chairs gave a presentation to Session on the current financial condition of the Child Care Center, which has been adversely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions. The Center is currently operating at a deficit due to reduced enrollment, and Session is contemplating potential actions to help support the Center. This will be a concern as long as the pandemic continues to cause restricted operations.

Session recognizes the need to continually communicate with our membership, and we welcome your suggestions for communication exchange.
