Ein feste Burg, ist unser Gott is one of the most famous hymns of all Christendom. Martin Luther penned this hymn, "A Mighty Fortress is our God," sometime around 1529. The text is a paraphrase of some elements found in Psalm 46, and in its earliest printing was labeled, "Ein Trost Psalm," meaning a psalm of comfort. God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

The melody will be heard in the soprano first, and second in the pedal, after which the ritornello returns once more and concludes with a triumphal flourish.

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

The original French text, sometimes attributed to John Calvin, seems to be a Protestant reworking of a Roman Catholic hymn, not a typical practice for him. Yet this text and tune (adapted from GENEVAN 124) clearly date from the early years of the Reformed tradition.

This Genevan tune (created for Psalm 118 but also used for Psalm 98 in the 1562 edition of the Genevan Psalter) has worked successfully with several English texts. Here it sets a 20th-century paraphrase of Psalm 98 that owes much of its effectiveness to the author's skill with multisyllabic words.

Long before Isaac Watts began to Christianize the Psalms, Martin Luther had already done so when he created the text and tune for this, his most famous hymn, which is based on Psalm 46. Luther encouraged metrical versions of psalms as well as chanted psalms and new hymns.
