CREATION CARE AT CATONSVILLE PRESBYTERIAN

Catonsville Presbyterian Church was certified as an Earth Care Congregation by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)'s Presbyterian Hunger Program through February 2025. This is our ninth consecutive year of certification. The Earth Care Congregation certification is designed to recognize churches that make the commitment to take seriously God's charge to "till and keep" the garden.

This status speaks to the serious commitment that our congregation has made to care for God's earth. To become an Earth Care Congregation, this congregation affirmed an Earth Care Pledge to integrate environmental practices and thinking into their worship, education, facilities, and outreach.

Started in 2010 by the PC(USA), the goal of this program is to inspire churches to care for God's earth in a holistic way, through integrating earth care into all aspects of their church life. The Earth Care Congregation certification honors churches that make that commitment and encourages others to follow their example.

Our church is one of the 331 congregations in our denomination that formally chose to dedicate themselves to intentional care of God's earth this year. This congregation's activities and commitment is meant to bring hope to our community and to the world.

PRELUDE

For the Beauty of the Earth, Setting by James Kasen

English poet, Folliott Sandford Pierpoint (1835-1917), penned the text to this hymn as he sat high on a hillside overlooking the English countryside and the winding river Avon, thinking about God's gifts in creation and God's gifts to the church. The original text, "Christ, our God, to thee we raise; This our sacrifice of praise" was meant for use during communion to portray Christ's sacrifice, as the host was lifted as an expression of God's gift to us, and our praise then lifted in return.



Jesus Christ is Risen Today Setting by Calvin Hampton

American composer and organist, Calvin Hampton (1938-1984) was educated at Oberlin Conservatory and Syracuse University. Erik Routley, an English authority on church music, called Hampton (before his death) "the greatest living composer of hymn tunes." Hampton's "Friday at Midnight" organ recital series at Calvary Episcopal Church in the Gramercy Park neighborhood of Manhattan, ran from 1963-1983 and was one of the most popular and wellknown organ recital series in American history.

THURSDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY

Next meeting on Thursday, April 18 | 10:30 a.m. in the Library

Thursday Morning Bible Study resumes for a special series that explores the Bible's understanding of death. The Bible does not speak with one voice on this subject. What we find in Judaism is a gradual unfolding of insights into the nature of death, God's relationship to death (and the dying), and speculations about life after death. Many of these ideas are present in the New Testament but take on new and deeper meanings after the accounts of Jesus' resurrection. Each week, we'll study a different passage of scripture and related theological themes, supported by additional articles and reflection pieces to inform our discussions. ADULT EDUCATION: CHRISTIAN NATIONALISM Sunday, May 5 at 9 a.m. in the Library | Led by Ken Kovacs

We take up an issue that we started to explore last November. Christian nationalism is a political ideology and cultural framework that seeks to merge American and Christian identities. In this day when both American identity and Christian identity are undergoing massive shifts in definition and meaning, the reappearance and rise of Christian Nationalism (CN) is an alarming, reactionary response.

The focus of our discussion will be Tim Alberta's article in *The Atlantic*, "My Father, My Faith, and Donald Trump" (November 28, 2023), adapted from Alberta's important new book *The Kingdom, the Power, and the Glory: American Evangelicals in the Age of Extremism* (Harper, 2023).

May 10 marks the 90th anniversary of the Barmen Declaration. Written primarily by Reformed theologian Karl Barth in 1934, Barmen was the manifesto of the Confessing Church during the Nazi period in Germany. Designed to prevent the capitulation of the churches to hostile cultural forces, it has been accorded authoritative status throughout the Protestant world, including the PC(USA), for its emphasis on the centrality and all-sufficiency of Christ. We will hold Alberta's article and Barmen in critical tension.
